We would like to inform you about our current university's precautions and measures regarding the COVID-19 pandemic. You can also find answers to some of the most frequently asked questions and concerns.

Situation for New Incoming ERASMUS+ Students

Current situation

- As of now, teaching activities, including preparatory language classes, are suspended and libraries are closed until May 11th 2020. The University of Freiburg bases its measures on the recommendations of the <u>Robert-Koch-Institute</u>.
- The city of Freiburg has issued a decree prohibiting gatherings of more than two people. People are advised to stay home and limit contact to others as much as possible.

Preparations before arrival

- For questions concerning courses and alternative teaching activities, you should contact your respective departmental coordinator. A list with the contact information of all coordinators is attached.
- Matriculation for international students has been digitalised. You have already received detailed instructions on how to enrol at our university. Please also note that our office is closed to the public, but we are still available via e-mail.
- We advise you to check for updates:
 - check your e-mails regularly
 - visit the <u>university website</u>
 - check your national health ministry as well as the German <u>Robert-Koch-</u> <u>Institute</u> frequently for recommendations and updates
- If you wish to cancel your mobility, please write an e-mail with subject "Incoming" to <u>europa@zv.uni-freiburg.de</u> and/or <u>Julius.wiedersich@zv.uni-freiburg.de</u>.
- Since there won't be any activities at the university until May 11^{th,} we highly recommend you to cancel your dormitory room for April as soon as possible. Else, you will have to pay the rent for April.
- If you wish to withdraw from your previous mobility cancellation, please write an e-mail to <u>europa@zv.uni-freiburg.de</u> and/or to <u>julius.wiedersich@zv.uni-</u>

freiburg.de with the subject "Incoming". You will also have the possibility to reapply for housing for May.

• If you travel from and/or through a high-risk area(s), you must take precautions and self-isolate for two weeks upon arrival in Freiburg.
